> ARRIVING IN KRAKÓW BY PLANE – JOHN PAUL II INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT KRAKÓW-BALICE (KRK)

John Paul II International Airport Kraków-Balice (KRK) is the main airport serving Kraków. It is located approximately 16 km from the city center.

Getting from the airport to the City Center by:

• Train: The Kraków Airport train station is located near the terminal, and trains depart every 30 minutes. The journey takes about 20 minutes to Kraków Główny (Main Train Station). The train schedule is available at: https://kolejemalopolskie.com.pl/

Where to buy a ticket?

- passenger terminal, arrivals hall, level 0 (ticket machine)
- railway station (ticket machine)
- on board the train (ticket machine or the train conductor)
- **Bus**: Public buses (lines 209, 300, and night bus 902) also connect the airport with the city. When leaving Terminal 1, you will find the bus stop on your right. Line No. 300 leaves approximately every half an hour, and it stops near National Science Centre (Stop: Rondo

Grunwaldzkie). Line No. 209 runs rarely and often changes its route. The journey takes around 40-50 minutes.

Where to buy a ticket?

- passenger terminal, arrivals hall, level 0 (ticket machine)
- the bus stop (ticket machine)
- on board the bus (ticket machine)
- Taxi: Official taxis are available outside the terminal. The ride to the city center takes around 20-30 minutes and costs approximately 100-150 PLN. An invoice can be issued at your request. Apps like Uber and Bolt operate in Kraków and offer an alternative way to reach your destination

> ARRIVING IN KRAKÓW BY TRAIN

The Main Train Station and the Main Coach Station are situated in the city centre, a 15-min walk from the Main Market Square.

Getting from the train station to the conference venue:

- *Tram: closed due to Grunwaldzki-bridge renovations
- Bus: Line No. 179 (Direction: Os. Kurdwanów). From the bus Stop: Dworzec PKP Kraków Główny directly to Stop: Rondo Grunwaldzkie (around 18 minutes journey)

- Taxi/Ride-hailing: Uber, Bolt, and local taxis are available for quick transport.
- Walking: If staying in the Old Town, NCN is about a 20-30 minute walk along scenic routes.

> CURRENCY IN POLAND

The official currency of Poland is the Polish Złoty (PLN).


- 1 EUR ≈ 4.2 PLN (exchange rates may vary)
- 1 USD ≈ 4.0 PLN

Cash can be withdrawn from ATMs or exchanged at exchange offices (kantor) located throughout the city. Credit and debit cards are widely accepted in shops, restaurants, and taxis.

ELECTRICITY

For Poland there are two associated plug types, types C and E (see the pictures below). Plug type C is the plug which has two round pins and plug type E is the plug which has two round pins and a hole for the socket's male earthing pin.

Poland operates on a 230V supply voltage and 50Hz.

- Every hour, a trumpeter plays the "Hejnał" melody from St. Mary's Basilica—a tradition dating back centuries.
